ACADEMIC PRIZES (UNDERGRADUATE)

DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year One of the Accounting and Finance programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year Two of the Accounting and Finance programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in the Final Year of the Accounting and Finance programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year One of the Accounting and Management programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year Two of the Accounting and Management programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in the Final Year of the Accounting and Management programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year One of the Accounting programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year Two of the Accounting programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in the final year of the Accounting programme.

THE EY ACCOUNTANCY PRIZE, to the value of £150, will be awarded annually for the best Dissertation on the Accounting and Finance/Accounting and Management degree programmes.

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION AWARD is made to a student who has made an outstanding contribution to the Department and/or University throughout the academic year or duration of a degree programme.

DEPARTMENT OF ANTHROPOLOGY

An **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT PRIZE**, to the value of £50, is awarded by the Board of Examiners for Anthropology programmes to the student who has achieved the highest mark in each year in each of the following degrees: BSc Anthropology, BA Anthropology, BA Anthropology and Archaeology and BSc Health and Human Sciences MAnth Social, MAnth Medical and MAnth Biological.

DAVID BROOKS MEMORIAL PRIZE to the value of £100, awarded by an independent panel of judges for the most original third year dissertation in social anthropology.

DEPARTMENT OF ARCHAEOLOGY

ARCHAEOLOGY DEPARTMENT LEVEL 1 PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Chair of the Board of Studies in Archaeology for the highest average examination marks achieved by any student doing three or more modules in Archaeology.

ARCHAEOLOGY DEPARTMENT LEVEL 2 PRIZE, to the value of £75, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Chair of the Board of Studies in Archaeology to a student doing three or more modules in Archaeology with the highest average examination marks achieved.

ARCHAEOLOGY DEPARTMENT LEVEL 3 PRIZES, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Chair of the Board of Studies in Archaeology to students with the highest marked dissertations in a series of defined areas:

DAME ROSEMARY CRAMP PRIZE: Medieval/Post Medieval Archaeology,

PROFESSOR ERIC BIRLEY: Classical Archaeology,

CANON WILLIAM GREENWELL: Prehistoric Archaeology,

FRED BETTESS: Scientific Archaeology

PROFESSOR TONY WILKINSON: Near/Middle Eastern Archaeology

GIBSON PRIZE IN ARCHAEOLOGY, to the value of £150, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Chair of the Board of Studies in Archaeology to the undergraduate studying single, joint or combined honours in Archaeology who submits the best dissertation on British Archaeology.

WILLIAM CLARKSON PRIZE, to the value of £150, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Chair of the Board of Studies in Archaeology to the Level 3 undergraduate performing best in the Final Honours Part Two examinations.

PETER SCOTT PRIZE, to the value of £100, awarded for special contribution made to the Department by a mature student.

FENWICK and BROTHWELL PRIZES:

Two prizes to the value of £50 each will be awarded for the Taught Postgraduate Masters programmes, one for the best dissertation in a Science subject (Brothwell Prize) and one in a Social Sciences Subject (Fenwick Prize).

MUSKETT HUNTER GILL PRIZE:

A prize of £500 is awarded to the best Masters dissertation on an aspect of the archaeology of Britain and Ireland between AD 350 and 700.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOSCIENCES

LEVEL 1 MODULE PRIZES, will be awarded for each Level 1 Department of Biosciences module to the student who has attained the highest mark for that module. NB:

- 1) An individual student can only be awarded one prize, so if the same student has performed top in more than one module they will be awarded a prize for the module for which they attained the highest mark; and not considered for other prizes.
- 2) Board of Examiners (BoE) to have discretion to award an exceptional prize if there was an individual student who attains the top mark for 3 or more modules.

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES PRIZE, awarded to the student registered on the Biological Sciences degree route who has attained the highest AWM at Level 2.

NATURAL SCIENCES PRIZES, awarded to the student registered on the Natural Sciences degree route who has attained the highest mark in the Department of Biosciences Level 2 modules.

LEVEL 2 PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENT/CONTRIBUTION TO ACADEMIC COMMUNITY PRIZE, awarded to the Level 2 student who, in the opinion of the Board of Examiners, has made the greatest contribution to the academic community and/or personal progress/achievement.

FOSTER PRIZE, awarded to the student registered on the Biological Sciences degree route who has attained the highest AWM at Level 3.

MBIOL PRIZE, awarded to the student registered on the MBiol degree route who has attained the highest AWM at Level 3.

NATURAL SCIENCES PRIZE, awarded to the student registered on the Natural Sciences degree route and on 3 or more Department of Biosciences Level 3 modules who has attained the highest marks in those modules.

LITERATURE REVIEW (BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES), awarded to the student registered on the Biological Sciences degree route who has attained the highest mark in the Literature Review module.

LITERATURE REVIEW (MBIOL), awarded to the student registered on the MBiol degree route who has attained the highest mark in the Literature Review module.

LITERATURE REVIEW (NATURAL SCIENCES), awarded to the student registered on the Natural Sciences degree route who has attained the highest mark in the Literature Review module.

BOULTER PRIZE, awarded to the Level 3 student who has attained the highest mark for the Workshop module.

BARKER PRIZE, awarded to the Level 3 student who has attained the highest mark for the Field Course module

CHRIS THOMPSON PRIZE, awarded to the Level 3 student who, in the opinion of the BoE, has attained the highest mark for a major piece of work in the field of neuroscience (Lit Review or Research Project).

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES ACADEMIC PROGRESSION PRIZE, awarded to the student who, in the opinion of the BoE, has shown the most improved performance in Biological Sciences between Level 2 and 3.

LEVEL 3 PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENT/CONTRIBUTION TO ACADEMIC COMMUNITY PRIZE, awarded to the Level 3 student who, in the opinion of the Board of Examiners, has made the greatest contribution to the academic community and/or personal

THE LAURA CORRIGAN PRIZE, to the value of £250 and established to commemorate Dr Laura Corrigan (1982-2020), a marine ecologist and graduate of Durham University, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Biological Sciences to a final year undergraduate displaying outstandingly knowledge and understanding in the field of environmental ecology as assessed through either dissertation or research project.

DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

ALUMNI PRIZE FOR MChem or MSci PROJECT THESIS, to the value of £200 and inaugurated in 2009, this prize recognises outstanding writing in an MChem project thesis.

DAVID BRINLEY ADAMS PRIZES FOR MChem or MSci POSTERS. This award will be made annually in memory of David Brinley Adams in recognition of academic excellence in the MChem poster competition. The fund is provided by private donation.

PRIZE FOR MASTERSHIP OF CHEMISTRY, This prize, first awarded in 1999 and currently worth £400, will be awarded annually, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners in Chemistry, to a graduand for the degree of Master of Chemistry.

PRIZE IN PHYSICAL CHEMISTRY, This award, inaugurated in 1994 and currently worth £200, is made at the discretion of the Board of Examiners in Chemistry, to an undergraduate who displays, in level-2 examinations, outstandingly good knowledge.

TWO CHEMISTRY MERIT PRIZES, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Chemistry to one second year student following any Chemistry degree programme (BSc or MChem) and to one third year student following the MChem programme, on the basis of a significant improvement in their end-of-year aggregate, normally from a score of 50% or more in the previous year.

THE HARRISON SHEARER BOOK PRIZE, inaugurated in 1980 and currently worth £200, is awarded annually in memory of Dr Harrison Massey McDougall Shearer (1923-1979), who died in post after serving in this department as lecturer (from 1959), then senior lecturer (from 1967), in chemical crystallography. The fund supporting the prize was raised by public subscription. The prize is awarded, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners in Chemistry, to a graduand for the degree of Bachelor of Science with Honours in Chemistry. The prize winner is named on the official pass-list and the prize will be presented at the reception for chemistry graduands on congregation day.

THE INDUSTRIALLY FUNDED PRIZE FOR ORGANIC CHEMISTRY, inaugurated in 1989 and currently worth £200, is made at the discretion of the Board of Examiners in Chemistry to the undergraduate with the most meritorious performance in level two organic chemistry (written examination and laboratory work). The Board will announce the prize winner before June registration for level three tuition. This award is currently being funded by Pfizer Limited.

THE THOMAS WADDINGTON PRIZE, to the value of £200 and established to commemorate Thomas Cudworth Waddington (1930-1981), Professor of the University in Inorganic Chemistry, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Chemistry to an undergraduate displaying, in level two assessments of inorganic chemistry, outstandingly good knowledge, understanding and laboratory skills.

PRIZES FOR LEVEL 3 MChem STUDENTS for the first and second most meritorious performances in level three examinations for the degree of Master of Chemistry (written examination and laboratory work).

THE MICHAEL WESTON SCHOLARSHIP This award, inaugurated in 1993 and currently worth £100, is made at the discretion of the Board of Examiners in Chemistry to an undergraduate of Grey College with a first-class performance in Part 1 examinations. The scholarship, funded by public subscription, commemorates Dr Michael Weston (1927-1992), second tutor in science at Grey College (1961-1981) then senior tutor (1981-1984), who was simultaneously a lecturer in radiochemistry (1957-1984).

All Grey College undergraduates who have completed *Core Chemistry 2* and at least one other level-2 module with a chemistry laboratory component are equally eligible, provided that they study *Core Chemistry 3* and one other level-3 chemistry module in Part 2. The Board reserves the right not to award the scholarship every year. The Board will notify the award winner at registration in June and the scholarship will be paid during the first week of the summer vacation.

DEPARTMENT OF CLASSICS AND ANCIENT HISTORY

THE FORSTER PRIZE, to the value of £150, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Classics for proficiency in language work.

THE HOW PRIZE, of books to the value of £70, will be awarded on the results of the Final Examination for the degree of BA (Hons).

THE MALTBY PRIZE, to the value of £500, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Classics for a final year dissertation in Classics by a candidate for Single or Joint Honours or Combined Studies.

MALTBY PRIZES, to the value of £50, will be awarded from the Maltby Prize Fund on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Classics for outstanding performances by students in their first or second year.

ACHIEVEMENT PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners to a first year student in recognition of outstanding performance in the first year of the programme.

The **COMBINED HONOURS IN SOCIAL SCIENCES YEAR TWO ACADEMIC**

ACHIEVEMENT PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners to a second year student in recognition of outstanding performance in the second year of the programme.

The **COMBINED HONOURS IN SOCIAL SCIENCES FINAL YEAR ACADEMIC**

ACHIEVEMENT PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners to a final year student in recognition of outstanding performance across the programme.

The **COMBINED HONOURS IN SOCIAL SCIENCES RESEARCH PRIZE**, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners to a final year student in recognition of exceptional achievement in their research project.

The **COMBINED HONOURS IN SOCIAL SCIENCES DIRECTOR'S PRIZE**, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually to a student in recognition of significant contributions to the life of the Combined Honours in Social Sciences community.

DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

THE SCOTT LOGIC PRIZE for Outstanding Contribution to the Durham Computer Science Community is awarded annually in recognition of the exceptional contribution of a final year student to the diversity, inclusion, and / or community culture within the Department (£250)

THE PROFESSOR SUE BLACK AWARD for Technology Evangelism is awarded annually in recognition of the exceptional contribution of a final year student to technology evangelism. (£200)

THE COMPUTER SCIENCE PRIZE for Outstanding Contribution to the Durham Computer Science Community is awarded annually in recognition of the exceptional contribution of a final year student to the community culture within the Department. (£200)

CERTIFICATE OF EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT (MEng) is awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Computer Science in recognition of being the top performing MEng Computer Science final year student. (£200)

CERTIFICATE OF EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT (BSc) is awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Computer Science in recognition of being the top performing BSc Computer Science final year student. (£200)

ADVANCED PROJECT PRIZE (MEng) is awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Computer Science in recognition of an outstanding performance in the Computer Science MEng Advanced final year project (£200)

INDIVIDUAL PROJECT (BSc) is awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Computer Science in recognition of an outstanding performance in the Computer Science BSc final year project (£200).

BEST SCIENCE COMMUNICATION is awarded annually to a student in recognition of achieving the highest mark for the Computer Science MEng Advanced final year project poster (£200)

BEST VISUAL GRAPHICS is awarded annually to a student in recognition of the best visual graphics for a Computer Science MEng Advanced final year project poster (£200)

CERTIFICATE OF EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT (Natural Sciences BSc/MSci), awarded to a student in recognition of being the top performing Natural Science finalist within Computer Science. (£200) (N.B. THIS WOULD BE AWARDED AT THE NAT SCI GRADUATION EVENT)

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN LEVEL 4, a certificate will be awarded to anyone who has achieved an Average Mean Weight greater than or equal to 80% that year.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN LEVEL 3, a certificate will be awarded to anyone who has achieved an Average Mean Weight greater than or equal to 80% that year.

THE SCOTT LOGIC PRIZE for Outstanding Achievement in Level 2 is awarded to the highest performing Level 2 Computer Science student (£250)

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN LEVEL 2, a certificate will be awarded to anyone who has achieved an Average Mean Weight greater than or equal to 80% that year.

THE ACCENTURE PRIZE for outstanding contribution to the Durham Computer Science community in Level 1 an award to recognise the exceptional contribution of a first-year student to the diversity, inclusion, and/or community culture within the Department in the student's first year of study (£250)

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN LEVEL 1, a certificate will be awarded to anyone who has achieved an Average Mean Weight greater than or equal to 80% that year.

DEPARTMENT OF EARTH SCIENCES

THE CHEVRON UK PRIZE, to the value of £75, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences to the undergraduate who has submitted the best dissertation for the degree of BSc in the field of Geophysics.

THE CHEVRON UK AWARD, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for performance in petroleum-related geophysics.

THE JOHN W. MOST FIELDWORK PRIZE IN GEOLOGY, to the value of £250, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for the best fieldwork project submitted by final year students for the BSc degree.

JOHN W MOST FIELDWORK AWARDS, to the value of up to £100 each, may be made annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for the best Earth Sciences fieldwork reports produced by any students on the BSc or MSci programmes.

NATURAL SCIENCES – EARTH SCIENCE PRIZE to the value of £100, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for overall performance in Earth Science modules.

THE BGA PRIZE to the value of £100, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for the best fourth year Geophysics performance.

PALAEONTOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION PRIZE, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for performance in Level 2 Palaeobiology.

THE LONDON PETROPHYSICAL SOCIETY AWARD, to the value of £200, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences “to the student judged most worthy” in geophysics/petrophysics for overall performance.

MINERALOGICAL SOCIETY AWARD will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for performance in Magmatism.

THE NORTH EAST GEOLOGICAL SOCIETY AWARD will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for performance in Environmental Geoscience.

BP PRIZE will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in Earth Sciences for the strongest performing first and second year undergraduates based on examination results.

JON DAVIDSON MEDAL, to be awarded on exceptional grounds. The award is to be given to a Level 4 student whose performance is outstanding.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS AND FINANCE

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year One of the Finance programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year Two of the Finance programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in the Final Year of the Finance programme.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year One of the Economics single honours programmes.

AN ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in Year Two of the Economics single honours programmes.

THE ADAM SMITH ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest mark in the Final Year of the Economics single honours programmes.

THE J.S. MILL PRIZE, to the value of £100, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest weighted average in the Final Year of Philosophy, Politics and Economics.

THE JO MASHEDER PRIZE, to the value of £25, will be awarded annually for the best performance in the History of Economic Thought or, if the History of Economic Thought module should not run, for the best dissertation in Economics.

THE BARCLAYS CAPITAL PRIZE, to the value of £400, will be awarded annually for the best performance in Monetary Economics.

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION AWARD is made to a student who has made an outstanding contribution to the Department and/or University throughout the academic year or duration of a degree programme.

SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – YEAR 1, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 1 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who achieves the highest overall average in that year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – YEAR 2, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 2 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who achieves the highest overall average in that year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – MATHS SPECIALIST, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 3 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who achieves the highest dissertation mark in Maths.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – SCIENCE SPECIALIST, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 3 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who achieves the highest dissertation mark in Science.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – ENGLISH SPECIALIST, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 3 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who achieves the highest dissertation mark in English.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – YEAR 1, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 1 BA (Hons) Education Studies student who achieves the highest overall average in Education modules that year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – YEAR 2, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 2 BA (Hons) Education Studies student who achieves the highest overall average in Education modules that year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – YEAR 3, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 3 BA (Hons) Education Studies student who achieves the highest overall average in Education modules that year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – YEAR 3, to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 3 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who achieves the highest overall average in that year.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – DISSERTATION, (YEAR 3 OR YEAR 4) to the value of £50 will be awarded, by the Board of Examiners, to a Year 3 or Year 4 BA (Hons) Education Studies student who achieves the highest dissertation mark.

THE MARY CHAMOT PRIZE FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN THE HISTORY OF ART is offered in memory of the distinguished art historian Mary Chamot and recognises outstanding achievement in Art Historical research. The prize of £100 is made on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners and is awarded to a graduating student who has submitted a dissertation in the History of Art, which demonstrates critical verve in the handling of the material, an innovative approach to the subject and has the potential for publication, hence demonstrating their outstanding abilities in research, understanding of the subject, critical interpretation and presentation skills.

NEVILLE'S CROSS AWARD, is awarded by the Board of Examiners to a Year 3 BA (Hons) Primary Education student who has shown an outstanding achievement in the academic and professional element of the course.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH STUDIES

THE J R WATSON AWARD, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners to the English student with the best overall performance in Part I Examinations.

THE JUBILEE PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in English Studies for the best final year dissertation submitted by a candidate for Honours in English Studies.

ROBIN DIX MEMORIAL PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually in memory of Dr Robin Dix, Lecturer in English Studies, on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners in English for the best essay on Restoration and Eighteenth-Century Literature or Renaissance Literature.

THE T W CRAIK AWARD, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners to the English student with the best overall performance in Final Honours Examinations.

THE BROOKS JOHNSON PRIZE, to the value of £25, for the encouragement of studies in the field of drama, may be awarded in alternate years on the recommendation of the Chair of the Board of English Studies, to a postgraduate student engaged in the field of drama or to an undergraduate student reading for the BA with Honours in English Literature who is pursuing the fullest opportunities of studying drama. Failing a suitable candidate in the first or second of the above categories, the prize may be awarded to a student of English Literature, undergraduate or postgraduate.

McKINNELL PRIZE, which may be awarded annually, at the Department's discretion, to an undergraduate or graduate for notably excellent work in the area of medieval studies within the English Department.

WINTON MSc MEMORIAL. To the value of £500, to be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners for the MSc in Mathematical Sciences to the student who has achieved the highest overall mean-weighted module marks.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

ELSEVIER RESEARCH PRIZE (previously known as the North Holland Physics Research Prize), to the value of €125 of books published by the Elsevier Publishing Company, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics to a postgraduate student at the end of the first year.

KEITH NICHOLAS PRIZE (May), to the value of £100, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics to a postgraduate student of Physics on the basis of outstanding overall performance. The prize will normally be awarded to students in their final year of supervised study.

THE ALAN MARTIN DOCTORAL PRIZE (May), to the value of £1000 will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics for the best thesis submitted by a postgraduate student studying for a doctoral degree in the Department of Physics. The award is made based on the supervisor's recommendation and the examiners reports on the Ph.D. and viva, which must have been completed.

GRAHAM RUSSELL PRIZE (May), to the value of £100, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics to a postgraduate student of applied physics on the basis of outstanding overall performance. The prize will normally be awarded to students for work in their final year of supervised study.

THE WINTON DOCTORAL PRIZE IN PHYSICS (May), to the value of £1000 will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics for the best thesis submitted by a postgraduate student studying for a doctoral degree in the Department of Physics using computational methods. The award is made based on the supervisor's recommendation and the examiners reports on the Ph.D. and viva, which must have been completed.

THE WINTON MSC PRIZE IN PHYSICS (October/November), to the value of £500 will be awarded by the Board of Examiner for the MSc in Particles, Strings and Cosmology to the student who has achieved the highest overall mean weighted module marks.

THE WINTON POSTER PRIZE IN PHYSICS (November), to the value of £150 for first place and £75 for two runners up, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics to the winner of the Winton Poster Prize. The posters will normally have been presented by the students at an academic conference within the previous 12 months.

THE ELLA BRYANT PRIZE (October/November), to the value of £100, will be awarded annually by the Board of Examiners in Physics to a postgraduate student on the basis of outstanding performance and citizenship. The prize will normally be awarded to students at the end of the first year.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

THE CRISTIANA CAVINA-PRATESI ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually, to the student who has achieved the highest overall mark in the year for the degree programme of MSc Cognitive Neuroscience. The award is made at the discretion of the Postgraduate Taught Board of Examiners.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT PRIZE, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually, at the discretion of the Postgraduate Taught Board of Examiners for Psychology, to the student who has achieved the highest overall mark in the year for the degree programme for which they are registered. One award is made per degree programme: MSc Developmental Psychopathology, MSc Behavioural Science, and MA Research Methods (Developmental Psychology).

THE ALA HOLA APPLIED STATISTICS AWARD, to the value of £50, will be awarded annually to the student who has achieved the highest overall mark in the Applied Statistics module. The award is made at the discretion of the Postgraduate Taught Board of Examiners.

BEST PGT DISSERTATION, to the value of £100, will be awarded to the student who achieves the highest dissertation mark.

LIGHTFOOT ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT PRIZE, to the value of £250, will be awarded annually by the Postgraduate Board of Examiners in Theology, for the best Masters dissertation.
