
**Sharing your wishes** 



Thank you for expressing an interest in putting a gift in your will. Many of our alumni and supporters are contributing to our University in this way and we see the impact every year:

- new scholarships help to relieve financial pressure for students,
- improved facilities allow us to deliver an outstanding student experience,
- increased research capability enables our academic staff to achieve the extraordinary.

With appropriate professional advice, revising a will need not be complicated. In this booklet, we offer practical information for you and your lawyer or will writer. We are here to answer any questions about the University or discuss how a gift could be directed. After writing your will, please complete the pledge form at the back of this booklet and return it by post, or share your wishes with us via email. ## Suggested wording for your will

## How to refer to the University as a beneficiary

The accountable body and legal entity for the purpose of the academic departments, faculties and the Business School, University sports, the library and any collections, and the colleges, with the exception of St John's College and St Chad's College, is Durham University. Where your wish is to refer to one of the colleges in your will, we suggest for the purpose of clarity that it is set out as follows: "[Name] College of Durham University, Palatine Centre, Stockton Road, Durham DH1 3LE".

If your gift is to St Chad's College or St John's College, they should not be set out in conjunction with Durham University, but in their own right and with their respective charity number and legal address. If your wish is a gift to University College Durham Trust, this is also a separate legal entity from the University; however, we work closely with the Trust, and so we would be pleased to make a record of your planned gift. If you state in your will that the gift is to a particular area of the University, your legacy will be directed as per your instructions.

Durham University is a UK Exempt Charity, meaning that it has charitable status and, as a higher education institution, it is regulated by the Office for Students. If you would like to use a unique identifier in your will to refer to the University, our tax exempt charity registration number is X6507.

# Suggested wording for a gift of a specific sum (known as a pecuniary gift):

'I give to Durham University (or named unit of Durham University) Palatine Centre, Stockton Road, Durham DH1 3LE, exempt charity tax registration number X6507, the sum of £...... or such larger sum as my trustees calculate to have the same present value at my death for its general purposes.'

I declare that the receipt of the University Chief Financial Officer or other authorised officer of Durham University shall be good and sufficient discharge to my Executors.'

## Suggested wording for a specific bequest e.g. painting, specific investments, a property:

'I give to Durham University (or named unit of Durham University) Palatine Centre, Stockton Road, Durham DH1 3LE, exempt charity tax registration number X6507, [description of item(s)] absolutely for its general purposes.'

Optional: 'I express the wish, but without creating any legally binding obligation, that Durham University use the said bequest for ......[description of intended use/direction].

I declare that the receipt of the University Chief Financial Officer or other authorised officer of Durham University shall be good and sufficient discharge to my Executors.'

# Suggested wording for a residuary bequest (the part of an estate that remains after specific legacies have been calculated):

'I give to Durham University, (or named unit of Durham University) Palatine Centre, Stockton Road, Durham DH1 3LE, exempt charity tax registration number X6507, ...... per cent of my residuary estate for its general purposes.'

Optional: 'I express the wish, but without creating any legally binding obligation, that Durham University use the said bequest for ........[description of intended use/ direction].

I declare that the receipt of the University Chief Financial Officer or other authorised officer of Durham University shall be good and sufficient discharge to my Executors.'
