

Registration Part 1: Enrolment

Complete enrolment. For instructions on how to do so, please see the enrolment information. here: **Enrolling with the University**

By the beginning of Welcome Week at the latest!

Registration Part 2: Verification of Identity

All new students are required to complete <u>verification</u> at college, providing proof of their identity. Ensure you bring one of the following:

- current Passport
- current UK Driving Licence
- current European Identity Card
- UK students who do not have either of these forms of identification may supply their original Birth Certificate.

Complete Registration Part 1 and 2 prior to collecting your Campus Card from college Reception which you need for access to key services.

All new students will be able to complete verification of identity in College
Reception from Wednesday
24 September onwards.

Registration Part 3: Collect Campus Card from College Reception

Campus cards will only be available to collect if you have completed enrolment.

Registration Part 4: (international students only) Complete **right to study check** within 2 weeks of arriving in the UK

Consent matters

Durham University is committed to promoting a culture in which sexual violence is not tolerated and will be addressed. It is **mandatory** for all new students to complete **the consent matters online course** via Oracle Learning before participation in clubs, societies or committees.

All students are also encouraged to complete the <u>Respect, Values and Behaviours</u> online training.

Access to Oracle Learn will be available to you upon completion of your University registration.

The University's Sexual Misconduct and Violence Policy and Procedure can be found here.

Complete the course before your arrival at college or by the end of Welcome & Orientation Week at the latest.



EARLY INDUCTION ARRIVALS

Students who are eligible for Disability Support's Early Arrival Programme can arrive in college from **25-26 September**. If you have signed up to be part of this, College will contact you separately with arrival information.

You will also be able to meet with a member of Student Support (either Jasmine or Indre) at 11am on Thursday 25 September in the Vice Principal's Office.

OVERSEAS STUDENTS ONLY

The International Office organises a coach transfer service as part of their 'Meet and Greet Service'. International students will need to book online to register for this service.

HOME/UK STUDENTS living in College will be able to book an available time slot for arrival on Sunday 28 September. This day will be busy in Durham and access by car to all the Colleges on the Durham peninsula is controlled by timed parking permits.

COLLEGE SUPPORT TEAM

The College support team can help offer support and advise on a range of issues and signpost to services within the University such as disability support, counselling and mental health services.

You can email johns.studentsuppoprt@durham.ac.uk with your query or to book an in person or online appointment to meet with either Jasmine Baker-Sones (Student Support & Enrichment Officer) or Indre Kennedy (Assistant Principal)

We ask all new students to meet with a member of our team in person during the first two weeks of term. This initial meeting is an important part of your transition to university life, giving us a chance to learn about your interests and goals, and to introduce you to the support and services available. ACADEMIC SUPPORT

There is a dedicated <u>student support officer (SSO)</u> in every academic department. They can meet during office hours to help you with any academic related concerns.

The <u>Academic Skills centre</u> offers a wide range of services centred around support and help with academic skills and development such as academic writing and time management for example. Students can book a one-to-one appointment with an adviser for help and support.

PEER TO PEER SUPPORT

St John's Common Room

Almost all John's students are members of the St John's Common Room (SJCR). We are *run by students, for students,* to support and enrich your time in John's.

Enrichment

We run sports and societies, free for members, and run St John's largest events, from Bailey Ball to Freshers' Week, to inter-college sports events and our College Celebration day, which enrich the student experience here. SJCR members can even start their own sports or societies if they feel something is missing!

Development

SJCR Members can vote in elections and run for positions from Freshers' Reps to Peer supporters, sports & society captains/presidents to our events and finance committees, to the SJCR Executive! There are over 100 volunteer positions in the SJCR and many different ways to get involved. We provide the opportunity for you to develop and gain skills alongside your degree whilst at St John's, improving both your CV and employability!



Support

The SJCR's very purpose is to support you. We run peer-support sessions, provide free welfare supplies, and run a series of "Stressless" events to help you relax in exam season. The SJCR also offers various student funds which provide financial support. One of our funds helps cover the costs of our ball tickets. In addition, our direction and spending is governed by students, so if you have an idea for a way to improve the SJCR or something we ought to be doing, then there's a good chance we can make it happen!

Representation

The SJCR represents its members through a range of elected positions. These can be specific such as our People of Colour Rep and our Interfaith Rep, all the way to the SJCR President who sits on university level committees to represent all SJCR members. The President is the only full-time position, with all others filled by student volunteers.

Subsidary Common Rooms

Within the SJCR is an MCR, specifically serving postgraduates and mature students, and a CCR, specifically serving Cranmer Hall students. Each has its own executive and resources to better represent and support these specific groups within John's.

Become a Member Now!

To get involved in all the SJCR has to offer, and to allow us to support you while at John's, all members pay a one off membership fee. This gives you cheaper ticket prices for all events, free membership in all sports & societies, and the ability to run for positions and vote in elections.



COLLEGE GYM
