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Update on APL

Summary of recent developments:

APL Guidance

Following our consultation on APL (9th June - 4th July 2014), we have now finalised our guidance and templates relating to APL policies and procedures.

Information on APL is now provided in the TEI Handbook. TEIs are advised to familiarise themselves with this information.

The procedural aspects of the APL guidance need to be implemented with immediate effect (i.e. for students entering Common Awards programmes in 2014/15). TEIs are advised to use the published guidance when considering APL claims. Any claims that need to be approved by the University should be sent to common.awards@durham.ac.uk.

We have now also published additional guidance on the Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning (APEL). You can find the guidance and the related APEL Checklist and Mapping Document template in the <u>APEL section of the TEI Handbook</u>.

Priorities for TEIs

MONTH*	ACTIVITY	BRIEF DESCRIPTION
AUG	Cohort-level APL requests	TEIs to send any outstanding cohort-level APL requests to the Common Awards team for approval.
	Individual APL requests	TEIs to use the published guidance when considering individual APL claims, and send any claims that need to be approved by the University to common.awards@durham.ac.uk.
	AP(E)L requests	TEIs to use the published <u>guidance</u> when considering AP(E)L claims, and send any claims that need to be approved by the University to common.awards@durham.ac.uk.
	APL Policies	TEIs to develop a very brief policy on APL in line with the principles set out in the APL guidance (see para. 19-20 of the guidance). As we anticipate that TEIs will want to progress this work alongside - or as part of - their admissions policies, we are inviting TEIs to send us their APL policies now.

Guidance on changes to partnerships

Guidance on the process for proposing changes to the approved Common Awards partnerships is now available in the TEI Handbook:

Proposing changes to approved partnerships

TEIs are advised to note that partnership changes include, but are not limited to:

changes in ownership or legal status of the TEI

significant changes in the TEI's financial standing

changes to constituent delivery centres (or equivalent) in multi-centre TEIs, including:

- adding a new centre
- changing the title of an approved centre
- merging two or more approved centres
- incorporating or merging a new centre within an approved centre
- · closing or removing an approved centre
- changes to relationships between constituent centres, where those changes alter the status of the TEI as a single legal entity

changes to campuses or delivery sites, including:

- opening a new campus
- closing an approved campus
- changing the name of an approved campus
