

Using the Bible Today (TMM1051)

Aims: To enable students, through an introductory study of contemporary interpretations of the Bible, to reflect on major issues facing Christians in the world today.

To enable students to engage with and evaluate understandings of biblical authority.

Content: The study of various understandings of biblical authority.
The study of selected hermeneutical approaches to biblical texts.
Consideration of the way in which the biblical text may be used appropriately to address at least one contemporary issue or situation in society or the life of the Christian church.
Introduction to some different approaches to using Scripture in Christian communication and ministry to begin to help students develop their own communication skills.
