

## Old Testament Text Study in Context (TMM2087)

**Aims:** To enable students to understand and to engage with one Old Testament text / book, understanding it in its own cultural and religious context, in the context of its New Testament interpretation, and in the context of an apt theological theme through Christian history.

To enable students to learn about a range of historical and contemporary approaches to engaging with the text.

To enable students to interpret the Old Testament text responsibly with regard to a range of contexts, making appropriate and knowledgeable use of the text in a variety of life / ministerial / professional settings.

**Content:** The study of one text / book of the Old Testament and consideration of its responsible exegesis in Christian theology, preaching and praxis.

**Learning Outcomes:** By the end of this module students will be able to:

Give an accurate and detailed account of the content of a specific Old Testament text.

Analyse and apply appropriately historical and contemporary approaches to engaging with the text.

Identify the questions and issues raised in interpreting the text in relation to their significance for the church and world.

Interpret the Old Testament text in relation to its historical, literary and/or canonical context(s), as appropriate, with a critical awareness of the questions raised by them.
