

Church and Sacrament (TMM2627)

Aims:	To introduce students to the formal study of Ecclesiology. To enable students to consider the theology of the sacraments.
Content:	Introduction to different models of the Church and their relationships to Scripture and Tradition. Exploration of the contours of sacramental ecclesiology in particular. Consideration of the theology of the sacraments. Focus on baptism and Eucharist. Consideration of key topics from confirmation, marriage, religious vows, ordination, penance, deliverance, anointing and sacramentals. Exploration of understandings of the ministerial priesthood in relation to these and in the contemporary context.

Learning Outcomes: By the end of this module students will be able to:

Subject Knowledge [SSK 2, 3]

Give a detailed account of **one or more** models for understanding the Church, analysing their relationships to Scripture and Tradition.

Discuss intelligently **one or more** theological accounts of the sacraments, baptism and Eucharist in particular.

Give a critical account of the ministerial priesthood and the role of the ordained in administering the sacraments in today's Church.
