Aims:	<p>To enable students to analyse theological, liturgical and pastoral responses to the different stages of the human life cycle.</p> <p>To enable students to reflect critically on their own experience of the human life cycle and on their own emergent ministerial practice.</p>
Content:	<p>This module will look theologically, liturgically and pastorally at different stages of the human life cycle:</p> <p>Christian rites of passage – Baptism, Marriage and Funerals - as a framework to investigate how pastoral needs change through life and may be addressed in part by rites of passage.</p> <p>The life stages of, for instance, Birth, Adulthood, Parenthood, Middle Age, Ageing and Death will be investigated theologically, with opportunities for the student to reflect on their own experience and on ministerial practice.</p> <p>Scripture will also be examined as a resource for reflection and practice.</p> <p>The module will encourage the student to build up skills and competences in providing informed pastoral care for people at different stages of the human life cycle and providing appropriate ritual which meets theological and pastoral needs.</p>
