Aims:	To equip students to think critically and creatively about the future of Christian leadership
	To enable students to engage theologically with appropriate scholarly discourses and models in future-leadership studies
	To develop students' understanding of ministerial leadership as a contextual activity, and to engage constructively with future-facing studies of leadership for the 21 st Century Church
	To equip students for reflective practice as leaders, enabling them to assess and evaluate what styles and methods of leadership are appropriate in different contexts
Content:	Critical engagement with key aspects of future-leadership studies (both inside and outside the Church) and their relevance for the Church, for example examining the relationship between the development of church leadership and existing public ministries
	Careful analysis of the changing relationship between the Church and contemporary western culture, the missiological implications, and implications for the future of church leadership. This may include what can be learned from secular discourses about changing narratives and models of leadership in a changing world
	Detailed engagement with the theology and practice of Christian leadership, with critical analysis of the relevant theological, missiological, ecclesiological, sociological, and leadership issues
	Throughout this study students will be invited to reflect on their own experiences of leading and being led. Focus may be given to one or more specific examples of opportunities and/or challenges raised by issues such as emerging church, mixed/blended economy, fresh expressions or church planting
