

Graduate Diploma in Theology, Ministry and Mission (120 Credits)

1. This programme is available at the **Lincoln School of Theology** in part-time mode of study, normally over two or three years.
2. Students should note that not all compulsory modules will be taught in each academic year and that the availability of the optional modules is dependent upon the availability of appropriate staff to teach them. If considering an interruption of their studies, students should discuss the possible impact of this with Lincoln School of Theology staff.
3. This programme is taught via blended delivery for the majority of modules, where approximately half of the teaching hours will be delivered in person, and half delivered online.
