## **Durham City Community Emergency Plan**

The Durham City Community Emergency Plan is nearing completion. It is important for us to have this plan as it means that local areas can liaise more efficiently with the County Council Emergency services and the Civil Contingencies Unit.

More importantly, it means that each local area has the knowledge and skills to help the area, and all its residents, while waiting for support from the emergency services. These could well be stretched in cases of widespread emergencies such as floods, power outages or hostile weather conditions, for example. There could be delays in reaching local areas.

In each area, volunteers are hard at work identifying local risks and threats, the resources that are available and the necessary information channels to respond in the event of an emergency.

Each area has identified places of safety if evacuation from homes is necessary. In areas at risk of flooding, local residents are training as flood wardens. Every household will be issued with a leaflet about these measures, with advice for managing such situations.
