







What can IROs do? Steps to get engaged

- **Step 1 - Identify a local coordinator** (better at central university level)
- **Step 2 - Promote VE among your departments, staff & students**
- **Step 3 - Identify individual professors/staff to be engaged**
(Forerunners & innovators)
- **Step 4 - Counselling and support**
- **Step 5 - Looking for potential synergies**
Integration in existing partnerships? In current/future projects? As CPD?
- **Step 6 - Systematic evaluation**

Why should you implement TEPs in your HEIs?

A **TEP** is a **Transnational Erasmus+ Virtual Exchange Project** specifically designed to respond to your needs.

It all depends on YOU! What are your **targets**? What are your **needs/aims**?

Is VE addressed to **students**?


Is VE addressed to **staff**?

Is it part of innovative education **strategy**?

Is it a way to address current challenging times?

Examples of TEPs implemented

1. **Exploring entrepreneurial eco-systems** in European countries - Higher Institute of Technological Studies of Béja (Tunisia) and Cracow University of Economics (Poland) (example 3 in the Handbook)
1. Developing **language and intercultural skills of new IRO staff** - Germany, Italy & Morocco (example 4 in the Handbook)
1. **Pre-mobility project** addressed to local and international students - University of Padova (example 5 in the Handbook)

Trainings to design a Virtual Exchange project


The Basic Training

Learning objectives:

- Understand VE from the perspectives of students and educators
- Explore ideas for VE projects from various disciplines, reflect and discuss these with peers
- Match Pedagogy and Technology
- Understand the logistics of setting up a VE project (how do you get people interested? who do you involve? what other aspects need to be taken into consideration?)
- Explore some real-life TEP Challenge scenarios and discuss them.

Skills developed during the course

Feedback from participants

“What I have learned during this month is that you never stop learning! I became interested in VE because I wanted to improve my students' skills but what I found is much more. I can see that there are many other professionals looking to exchange ideas and willing to work together to make things possible. I was pleasantly surprised by the variety of projects and the many ways in which different subjects and courses can collaborate, even for those in administrative roles” (S.)


The Advanced Training

Aim: to take partnering educators and their support teams through the **steps** required to design and implement a successful **Virtual Exchange**, including **logistics, learning objectives, tasks** and **tools**.

Duration: 6 weeks, 2-3 hours per week, including regular **contact between partners**, and **online synchronous sessions**. At the end of the training, partners will have designed their own project in detail and will be ready to implement their exchange, usually in the following semester, with the support of the course tutors.

The Advanced Training is designed for educators who have already **established a partnership** and have a general idea for the primary aims of the Virtual Exchange they would like to design and implement.


