### Latin American cinema and environmental politics: Colombia & Cuba

St Chad's College, Durham University, 15-17 November 2018



A three-day international network event at St Chad's College, Durham University, bringing together film specialists working in Colombia, Cuba, France, the UK and the US. The work sessions will focus on the spaces and archives, environments and ecological perspectives of recent Caribbean, Latin American and Global South cinemas. Structured as a series of focused seminars and workshops, the event will centre around recent documentary, fiction and conceptual works by, among others, Oscar Campo (Colombia), Laura Huertas Millán (France and Colombia) and Rafael Ramírez Pupo (Cuba) and Juan Soto (UK and Colombia).

Participants will include Oscar Campo (Universidad del Valle, Cali), María Fernanda Arias (Universidad de Antioquia, Medellín), Laura Huertas Millán (Paris), Rafael Ramírez (EICTV, San Antonio de los Baños, Cuba), Juan Soto (London), Juana Suárez (NYU Tisch School of the Arts), and Pedro Adrián Zuluaga (Bogotá).

Seminars 1 and 2 will be conducted in English. All other discussions will take place mostly in Spanish, but English interpreting will be available.
