Why PPE/E&P at Durham?

Departments

- Approximately 45-50 members of academic staff teaching economics
- Part of the Durham University Business School
- Approximately 50-55 members of academic staff teaching Politics

Economics and Politics

- 1st Year:
- 3 Economics (Principles, Methods + Global Economic History)
- 3 Politics (same list as PPE)
- 2nd Year:
- 3 Economics and 3 Politics (same choices as PPE)
- 3rd Year
- Either 3/3 or 4/2 in either direction (same lists as PPE)



How we currently deliver

Large Group (approx. 20-500 students):

Lectures

Small Group (most modules approx. 10-30 students):

- Seminars/Tutorials
- Workshops
- Computer Practicals

Individual:

Private study (individual and group study)

Assessment & feedback methods


- Formative assignments: 'mock' assessments in all modules
- Written examinations: both seen and unseen questions/cases
- **Summative assignments**: investigation and research projects, case studies, critical essays, presentations
- Dissertation: individually assessed original research
- Feedback: seminars, regular staff contact times, written and oral feedback, office hours

Our students' dissertations are outstanding!

Carroll Round

- Annual Economics conference at Georgetown University (USA)
- Participation funded by the Economics Department





- The world's top undergraduates present and discuss their dissertation
- 8 accepted students from Durham over the past three years

- Web-based learning environment (Blackboard Ultra)

- Written and oral feedback
- Support from assigned academic staff (Programme Director and PPE Contact in Politics and Philosophy)

How Your Degree Class will be Determined

Based on a weighted average of your performance in your second (40%) and final year (60%) modules.

PPE with Study Abroad


4 years: 1st and 2nd in Durham; 3rd year abroad; 4th year in Durham

The fourth year = third year of the VL52 PPE degree (Dissertation etc.)

Countries:

Denmark, France, Italy, Germany, Spain, Sweden

Australia, Canada, Chile, China, USA, and others





PPE with Work Placement

4 years: 1st and 2nd in Durham; 3rd year working; 4th year in Durham

The fourth year is equivalent to the third year of the VL52 PPE degree (Dissertation etc.)







Placement Year

40+ weeks paid work experience in year 3

- Enhanced graduate prospects
- Transferrable skills and knowledge
- Expand your professional network and industry contacts
- Potentially achieve a higher class degree classification

(In 2019, at DUBS 52% achieved a 1st, compared to 13% of non-placement students)
