What is a Placement Year?

- Taken between your 2nd and 3rd year (aside from some science subjects)
- Minimum 40 weeks full time professional level work experience.
- Formally assessed on a pass or fail basis (aside from Chemistry). This means it does not affect the overall classification.





Why do a Placement Year?

- Enhance your CV
- Trial your future career
- Increase your academic prospects
- Earn money
- Discover a new city or country





How much are students paid on a Placement Year?

- At least National Minimum Wage, normally about £21k £26k (taxed, pro rata).
- Some Placement Years pay £19k, some as much as £60k+ (certain investment banks).
- You pay a reduced Tuition Fee during the Placement Year of 20% of your normal Fee as you must remain a registered DU student during the year (the PY becomes an assessed part of your degree).
- We don't promote unpaid Placement Years but will not prevent you from taking one if you can afford to do so (we have no funding to replace a salary).
- Home students can also apply for a reduced Maintenance Loan, whether their role is paid or unpaid.





A quarter of graduates hired in 2022 were recruited through employers' work experience programmes.



Who can do a Placement Year?

ALL undergraduate courses offer the placement year degree variant (except for language programmes) and you make the choice to do a placement in your second year.

The following courses all have placement year or with industry as an option on UCAS:

- Accounting and Finance
- Accounting and Management
- Business and Management
- Chemistry
- Economics
- Economics with Management
- Finance
- Marketing and Management

Quality Assurance

Placements have a dual approval process to make sure opportunities are safe and are at the appropriate level. Organisations must sign a placement contract with the University.


Practical Support

Attended CV, cover letter, and interview workshops through the University


Applied to multiple roles and secured my placement by January
