Our Degrees...

We offer degrees in: Criminology; Sociology; and Anthropology and Sociology (with the Department of Anthropology)

Our standard offer for all programmes is: A-level AAB or equivalent

Applicants from low-participation areas may be eligible for a reduced "contextual" offer

We currently receive ~150 new Criminology and Sociology students in a year

Durham Criminology is interested in answering these questions from a Sociological perspective It is not about psychology, law or operational police work E.g. Why do people engage in criminal / deviant behaviour?
