



Awards, Grants & Financial Support

St Cuthbert's Society is able to offer some additional financial support to students and societies to help them progress in their **personal** and **professional development**. We have established a number of grant and award schemes which can be applied to for support towards various types of activity.

Student Development Grants

The Student Development Grants are available to students at any level of study, and are given to support personal, academic and professional development. These are awards of up to **£250** for individuals or group awards of up to **£500** for sports teams or societies to attend events, tours, competitions or projects. Development Grant applications open once a term.

St Cuthbert's Society Bursaries

The Bursaries Fund will be used to provide substantial grants to incoming students for whom participating in the life of St Cuthbert's Society represents a significant financial challenge.

For the 2022-2023 entry we hope to offer bursaries of up to **£1500** to incoming full-time home undergraduates whose household income as assessed by Student Finance England (or equivalent) is less than or equal to £32,000.

Bursaries will awarded subject to successful application. Details on how to apply will be available shortly.



SCR Performing Arts Grants

The Senior Common Room (SCR) award Performing Arts Grants to help Cuth's students take up opportunities around the country on the stage or musical platform. These grants of up to £100 help to cover travel and other expenses.

An SCR Performing Arts Grant helped Kishore (English Studies) perform with Cuth's Drama Society at the National Student Drama Festival, at which he won the Spotlight Award for Most Promising Actor!



Durham Grants

The Durham Grant provides:

- Extra financial support of £2,000 per year to full-time home undergraduates who do not already have an undergraduate degree and whose household income as assessed by Student Finance England (or equivalent) is less than £25,000;
- OR
- extra financial support from £2,000 down to £200 on a sliding scale to full-time home undergraduates who do not already have an undergraduate degree and whose household income as assessed by Student Finance England (or equivalent) is between £25,000 and £42,875.

The Durham Grant is non-repayable, and you do not have to apply for it. Your Durham Grant will be paid into your bank account even if you are living in College accommodation. It is strongly recommended that you use your Durham Grant to pay your College accommodation.

If your household income as assessed by Student Finance England (or equivalent) remains below £42,875, you will receive a Durham Grant for every year you are a registered student of the University (even if you're on a year abroad or on a placement year).
