PGT Dates and Deadlines

- The admissions cycle opens at the beginning of October each year for entry in the following September/October
- The current application deadlines are:
 - 31 July 2025 for applicants who will require a student visa
 - > 31 August 2025 for applicants who will not require a student visa
- Please apply early if possible as some courses may close to admissions if they become over-subscribed
- A few courses may also have earlier deadlines which will be advertised on the relevant academic department webpages, eg MSc Management programmes

The PGR Admissions Cycle

- The cycle normally opens on 1st October each year
- Intakes for departments vary October/January/April starts
- Most programmes have no official application deadlines (any deadlines will be clearly stated on relevant academic department web pages) but applicants must consider admissions decision and processing turnaround times, especially if a student visa is required
- Encouraged to apply early if possible
- PGR applications are submitted to the Applicant Portal and considered by the department, with Admissions issuing the decision

Staged Admissions

- The following courses operate a staged admissions process:
 - Full-Time MBA
 - MSc Business Analytics
 - MSc Marketing
 - MSc Scientific Computing & Data Analysis (Computer Vision & Robotics)
 - MSc Conservation of Archaeological & Museum Objects
- These courses have application deadlines throughout the admissions cycle with multiple rounds of applications





Course Search and How to Apply

- Search our courses on our website, either on academic department webpages at <u>Academic - Durham University</u> or the course search functionality at <u>Study - Durham University</u>
- Look at the relevant Entry Criteria for your chosen course
- Open the Application Portal at <u>Home · Application Portal (microsoftcrmportals.com)</u> and create an account
- Use the course search option in the portal to locate the course you want to apply for, select the academic year (2025/26 for courses starting in September 2025, or 2024/25 for any PGR courses prior to this), mode of study (full-time or part-time) and click on Apply
- Complete all sections of the application form and click on Submit (or Save it and submit later)

Entry Criteria

- Academic requirements:
 - For PGT normally an upper second class (2:1)
 Bachelor degree or international equivalent
 - For PGR normally a Masters degree or international equivalent
 - Some courses will have degree subject and/or module requirements
 - International Office set international equivalencies
- English language requirements
 - Direct entry and pre-sessional entry requirements
 - UKVI SELT may be required (if pre-sessional only CAS needed)
 - English Language Requirements Durham University
- Personal statement or research proposal for PGR
- References (if required)
- Programme specific requirements, eg interview or relevant experience



Application Fee

- There is a £60 application fee for all Business School MSc programmes
- After submitting your application, you will receive an action request in your portal asking you to pay the application fee
- We will not consider your application until the fee has been paid
- You can only pay and be considered for one programme per programme suite





Application Portal

- Apply at <u>Home · Application Portal</u> (microsoftcrmportals.com)
- View all applications either started or submitted
- View application status
- View action requests and notifications
- Raise an enquiry
- View offer
- Accept offer
- Upload documents
- Apply for a pre-sessional English language course (if eligible)
- View and approve CAS details (if required)





Types of Application Decisions

- Conditional Offer
 - Academic
 - English Language (inc pre-sessional)
 - References
 - > Other
- Unsuccessful Decision
- Invite to Interview
- Further Information Required





Pre-Sessional English Language

- 6 / 10 / 20-week courses all offered on-campus in 2025
- Must be stated as an offer condition on your offer letter in order for you to be able to apply (or unconditional)
- Pre-sessional English eligibility requirements are on our website at <u>Pre-Sessional English Language Required -</u> <u>Durham University</u>
- Apply via the application portal
- Must pass in order to progress to your main Masters programme





CAS

- Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies
- Enables international applicants to apply for their student visa
- In order to be eligible for a CAS:
 - Accept offer
 - Pay deposit (if required)
 - No outstanding offer conditions
 - Documents must meet UKVI guidelines (eg translations)
 - Can only issue CAS 5 months before programme start date
- Combined CAS possible if English Language is the only outstanding offer condition and applicant accepted onto a pre-sessional English language course
- UKVI SELT will be required if pre-sessional only CAS is needed



Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS)

- Linked to national security & anti-terrorism legislation
- Mandatory requirement within immigration rules for students intending to enter or remain in the UK
- Students who require ATAS will not be able to register onto their programme without it
- Affects applicants planning to undertake a degree in some science, engineering or technology disciplines
- If offered a place and ATAS is required, the offer letter will include CAH3 code and ATAS statement of purpose
- Applicants apply online for an ATAS clearance certificate at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office website
- Admissions are unable to expedite this process



PGR only:

- Contact the academic department of the programme you would like to apply for to register and discuss your research interests and to explore potential supervisor availability
- Visiting Research students need to apply and are considered in the same way

Application Considerations:

- For PGT, the PG Admissions Team consider applications in close liaison with academic departments
- For PGR, academic departments consider applications



After Applying:

- 1. Receive Interview Invite attend interview 2, 3, or 4 below OR
- Receive Unconditional Offer (see over)
- Receive Conditional Offer (see over)
- 4. Receive Unsuccessful Decision End
 OR
- 5. Receive Action Request asking for Further Information provide requested information/documentation 1, 2, 3 or 4 above



2. Receive Unconditional Offer

- Accept Offer in Portal
- Pay Deposit (if required)
- College membership/accommodation
- CAS/Visa (if required)
- Online Enrolment
- Arrive



3. Receive Conditional Offer

- Accept Offer in Portal
- Pay Deposit (if required)
- College membership/accommodation
- Meet offer conditions
 - Apply for pre-sessional English course if required
- CAS/Visa (if required)
- Online Enrolment
- Arrive



Funding

- For PGR this will vary from department to department contact your department directly to check what funding opportunities may be available
- The Business School offers scholarships automatically for strong PGT offer holders
